WWII Google Presentation Requirements

On May 13th-16th, 7th grade students will present an end-of-year Google presentation about the subject covered in the WWII research paper. This is a way for students to show the class what they learned and for the class to learn about many WWII topics in depth in a short amount of time. This is one of your last assignments in 7th grade Social Studies and will be graded accordingly. A minimum of seven slides and a maximum of ten slides must be presented. A bibliography is not required since you cited your sources in your paper. ©

The presentation is **DUE** in Google Classroom on May 13th at 8am. You need to be able to present the day that you are called on in class, or your presentation will be considered late.

Specific slide requirements:

- Each slide must contain 3-5 bulleted items (**not copy & pasted information from internet sources**)
- Titles of slides should be creative (not "Who, What, When, Where, and Why")
- All slides should contain the same design template with appropriate colors easily viewed by the audience. Points will be deducted for difficult-to-read slides. Make sure your slide theme corresponds with the topic (For example, do not use a theme that has a happy feeling for a topic such as the Bataan Death March.)
 - **Points will be deducted for animation** used UNLESS it is an animated map that explains war strategy or the events of a battle or something similar related to your topic.
- **SLIDE 1** -- An opening slide should contain the title and the presenter's name.
- **SLIDE 2** -- The introductory slide should be a clear detailing of what you are presenting and a brief outline of what's coming. This should be in bullet points; **DO NOT write this in a statement or paragraph.**
- **SLIDE 3** This slide should contain the major question (or questions) that your project answers. This is the research question that you turned in with your outline.
- **SLIDES 4-6 (if you are doing a 7 slide presentation)** should present the substance of your project. This can be done in any order that you deem appropriate, but it must follow a logical sequence.

- You are allowed to present a **short** video that creates interest in your subject on any slide (slide #s 4-9). This is not a requirement and **should only be done if it adds to your presentation.**
- The final slide should consist of **two bullet points**:
 - 1. State the **research question** that you raised with this topic.
 - 2. State your **thesis statement** that answers the question.
